Transcripts from any previous colleges attended will be requested of all program applicants (unofficial transcripts will satisfy this request initially) and applicable transfer credit will be mapped into the program plan that follows providing the applicants with a clear picture of how many transfer credits could be awarded and, logically, how many credits will then be required at Troy University in order to be awarded the Bachelor of Science in Human Services. This academic plan will be developed working with a member of the Troy University Admissions Team.
