



Bachelor of Science Human Services

Program Purpose: The purpose of the Human Services Program is to graduate quality entry level human service professionals. The programs vision is to assure human service professionals with human services knowledge, values and skills to practice within the context of a diverse multicultural, global and technological oriented society. An educational environment for learning is provided which upholds the traditions, values and ethics of the human services profession.

Individuals interested in helping others will find a degree in human services will prepare them for a variety of professional roles. Human services professionals may choose areas of practice that allow them to assist children and families, the elderly, the homeless, immigrants or veterans. In addition, human services professionals may assist people with addictions, criminal records, disabilities and mental illnesses.

Human services professionals work in a variety of organizations such as those assisting people with finding employment and appropriating food, nutrition, housing and shelter. Human services professionals may also serve as victims' assistants or work in public safety or disaster relief.

BHMT sponsored students entering this program will likely enter as transfer students having already earned college level credits through studies with a BHMT academic partner. Transcripts from any previous colleges attended will be requested of all program applicants (unofficial transcripts will satisfy this request initially) and applicable transfer credit will be mapped into the program plan that follows providing the applicants with a clear picture of how many transfer credits could be awarded and, logically, how many credits will then be required at Troy University in order to be awarded the Bachelor of Science in Human Services. This academic plan will be developed working with a member of the Troy University Admissions Team.

The BS Degree in Human Services at Troy University **requires**:

- 1. **45** hours of General Studies classes
- 2. **36** hours of Human Services Major classes; a core of 24 semester hours of required classes and 12 hours of advisor approved classes selected from Human Services, Rehabilitation or Social Work.
- 3. **18** hours of Minor requirement
- 4. **21** hours of advisor approved electives
