

DECISION MAKING MODEL: Numerical Rating Method

If you have more than 1 job title you are considering, this exercise can help clarify your top priorities and learn how they will affect your job choice.

1. Clarify your purpose.

2. Choose and rate your decision making criteria. What is important to you?
