### 3 Tips for Career Development

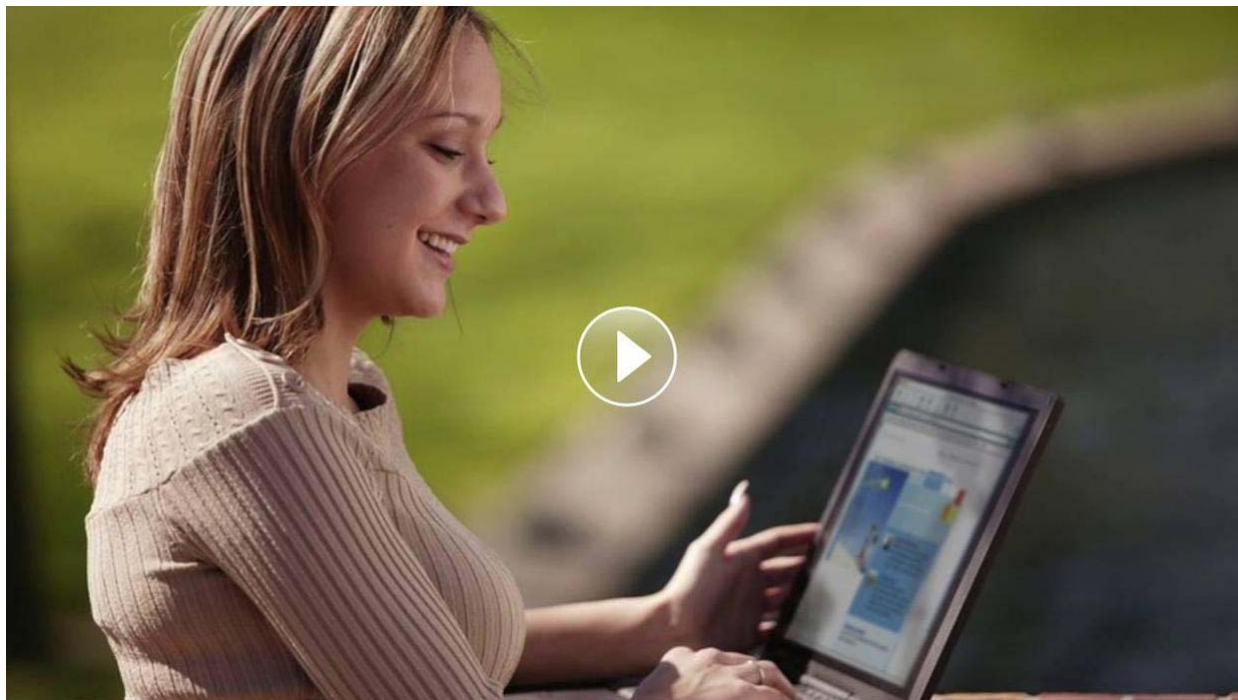
