"I encountered a lot of my fellow classmates in my MBA Program who suggested that I get a PM certificate to continue to advance within my career," she says, "BHMT pays upfront, so it was wonderful having the entire program prepaid for." Rachel only has two classes left to complete and will be done at the end of this year.
