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

GA Staff Nurse Shows How Persistence Can Inspire Those Around Us

Kristina Bailey started working at Kaiser two and a half years ago, and as a Staff Nurse, she was interested in utilizing her employee benefits. Once she heard about the RN-to-BSN Program offered through the Ben Hudnall Memorial Trust, she knew she had to take advantage.

"I was very excited to receive more information on the program. It was like winning a jackpot!"

Kristina began her academic journey with <u>CTU</u> to complete her prerequisites courses, starting off with <u>Statistics</u>. "I highly recommend CTU." Once she completed her necessary courses, she researched through the pre-selected colleges for the RN-to-BSN Program. "It was a hard choice to make," she says, but she eventually decided to register at Regis University. After receiving a student discount on top of the \$19,100-lifetime maximum benefit from BHMT to be used on Stipend time and/or tuition payments, Kristina found the program to be very "affordable."

Receiving straight A's in all of her classes, Regis has decided to showcase a few of Kristina's papers as an example of exemplary student work. While doing so well in school, she is also taking what she is learning and applying it to her role at KP. She has learned skills, developed ideas, and is now pulling relevant and current research for patients. "I am able to stay up-to-date on everything." Kristina is also a participant of <u>CE Direct</u> to maintain her Continuing Education Units.

"It has been excellent. I have used it to get my Nursing CE requirements without any added cost. I can also go on there and find specific subjects that directly pertain to my patients or to learn more about other subjects that interest me to expand my knowledge. The only problem is there is so many to choose from and not enough time to do all I would like."

Kristina is now halfway through the program and is already thinking about her next steps. "Leadership/management is my focus, so I plan to pursue my MSN once I graduate." She believes that "education is key."

BHMT Career Counselor Darlene Martin has helped guide Kristina along the way. "Darlene Martin is very supportive," she says, but Kristina's family has also been by her side every step of the way, making it even more imperative for her to reach her academic goals. Her husband was diagnosed two years ago with metastatic prostate cancer at the age of 47. "He is holding strong and is a huge inspiration to me," she says, "Without the help of the Trust and my family, I would have never been able to do it. Going through this program has been such a great experience."

With a deep passion for life-long learning and continuing to advance her career, Kristina makes it a point now to encourage others to take advantage of all that BHMT has to offer

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"These programs are not for just nurses. They are for everyone," she says, "If I can encourage just one person to go back to school and pursue their career dreams, I will be happy."


BHMT participants are given a 1-year online subscription and can access 17 self-selected programs:
