

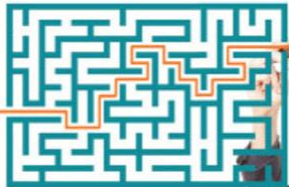

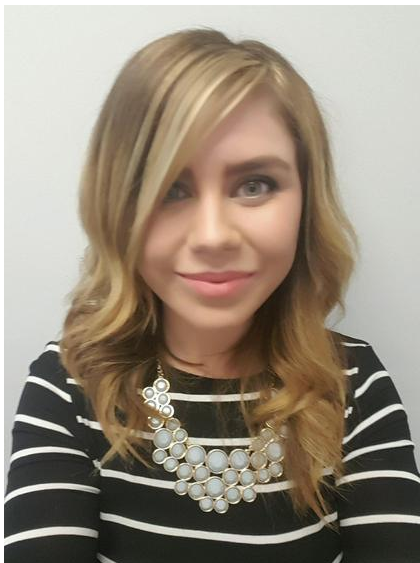

3 Tips for Career Development

How to Create a Compelling Resume

It's been quite some time since the *one-version-fits-all* resume worked for job seekers. Given the specialization of positions in today's work world, resumes are now expected to be targeted to each specific position.

Applicants who present themselves as a "good fit" via their resumes are more likely to get serious consideration. Prospects who seemingly don't meet the job criteria will be readily discarded, so how do you know what the hiring manager is *really* looking? Or how to convey that you can do the job, be a great team member, and handle the demands of the position?



Here are 3 tips on **how to create a compelling resume**:

1. Do a Job Posting Analysis—using **four** different highlighting or font colors, identify each of the following key job qualifiers:

- The **Skills** needed,
- The **Experiences** that are relevant,
- The **Knowledge** (and/or degrees) that are required,
- And any **Personal Qualities** that may be indicated.

Don't worry if you're not exactly sure which category certain key parts of the job description fall into. Make your best guess and color-code content according to the category that seems right.

2. Organize the highlighted information into a 4-column table—the column headings should mimic the 4 categories of information you've color-coded:

- **Skills**
- **Experiences**
- **Knowledge**
- **Personal Qualities**

Beneath each heading, transfer (copy and paste) the color-coded text into its corresponding column.

3. Customize (target) your resume for that specific job—using the information acquired from doing the analysis and creating the 4-column table, note the skills, experiences, knowledge, and personal qualities that you already possess. Be sure to incorporate those attributes into your resume. You may also need to delete information that's on your resume that's not relevant to the role you're applying for. By doing this, you'll have a targeted resume that best represents you.

Please note: *Keep the table handy as a future reference when preparing for an interview for that job.*

The real purpose of a great resume is to get an interview, not to get a job. By presenting yourself as a strong candidate, you are more likely to compel recruiters and hiring managers to want to meet you. Once you're in the interview, you'll be able to sell yourself as the best person for the job! *Presented by Paulette Fried, GA BHMT Career*

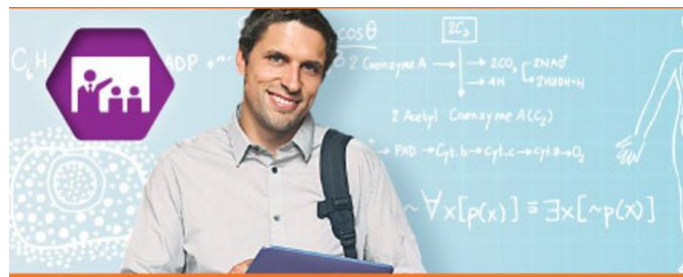
