3 Tips for Career Development

BHMT-eligible employees who take advantage of their many education benefits are successful at completing degrees. Those who are on the clinical path also have success passing their boards and becoming licensed. These are huge successes, and if you have recently completed your degree, we congratulate you!



Here are 3 tips to help you navigate through your next steps:

- Continue your momentum and organize your job search. Your positive attitude, persistence, and commitment to reach your goals continue during this next phase of your career progression. First, meet with your BHMT Career Counselor to develop the next phase of your career plan. Continue to work with your network which may include your manager, mentors, union representatives, and co-workers and review KP job descriptions for positions of interest.
- Be open and flexible when transitioning from your current position to your new career. Your first position after obtaining your degree may not be the perfect shift or your ideal facility/location. Some short term sacrifices such as a longer commute are sometimes the required stepping stone to obtain the experience required. Once you have gained the necessary experience, increased your skills and confidence, you will be more prepared to apply to other shifts and locations. Don't pass up an opportunity because it isn't your perfect job, or it may delay your career transition by months or even years.
- Take advantage of the resume writing and interview preparation available. Your BHMT Career Counselor has expert advice and guidance to ensure that your KP Profile and resume are communicating your talents, qualifications, and unique attributes. In addition, your Career Counselor can assist you to prepare for interviews. Don't assume that since you have a lot of seniority or know the interviewers that you can just "wing it". Interviewing is selling yourself! Your Career Counselor can help you develop "your story", practice your responses, and give perspective on what interviewers are actually looking for.
