3 Tips for Career Development

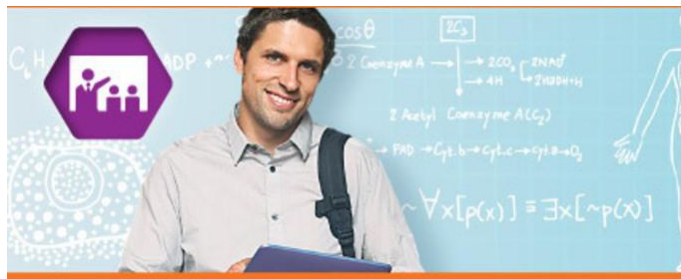
It is much easier to proceed if you divide the job-navigating process into smaller, more manageable bites. As you do this, you will quickly learn that each one of these necessary skills is a bit of a game, and once you have internalized this, you can then learn how to play the game to win.



Here are 3 tips on how to **increase your odds** of getting where you want to go:

- 1. The Likability Game:** Everyone knows that it is important to be perceived as competent and capable while going through the job search process. But, many don't realize that it is also critically important to let your likeability show. If a hiring manager has a highly-qualified candidate who has a bit of an edge vs. a qualified person who is highly likable, s/he will more often go with the likable candidate. Let your pleasant, gracious, and respectful dimensions show by not being overly serious in the more casual interactions of the hiring process.
- 2. The Resume Game:** You win the resume game if you are invited to an interview. To increase your odds, you should optimize your resume by highlighting the skills and the quantified/qualified impact you have made that align with what is important to the interviewer. To include all you have done can distract the reader; make the effort to target your content to the job you are applying for.
- 3. The Interview Game:** You win the interview game if you receive a job offer. Don't pull yourself out of consideration for a job because you think you don't want it. You don't know what you are saying "no" to until you have an offer. Additionally, knowing how to get an offer is an excellent skill to master so take advantage of the opportunity to practice.
